MESSAGE IN A BOTTLE

We are currently piloting a new “Message in a Bottle” Emergency Information Scheme, inspired by the popular programme run by the ambulance service in the past.

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This is a way for patients to be reassured that essential information is available to emergency services should they be called, as well as providing an information source for family and friends who may have an occasional care role for the patient. We hope that this project will be a useful adjunct to the written care plan rolling out across the area.

Our care co-ordinators, Syd and Tracey, will introduce the product to patients when attending for follow up visits. Patients will be provided with a bottle to be stored in the fridge; an insert which includes all vital information; a fridge sticker and a window sticker. Flyers will be circulated to practices for display. If the pilot proves to be successful, we hope to roll the Message in a Bottle out to a much wider audience across the Durham Dales Area.
